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## Introduction

This syllabus has been developed and approved by the Academic Council of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (UWED) for the disciplines **“Uzbek Language I” and “Uzbek Language II”** and serves as a unified regulatory document governing the content, structure, and organization of the educational process within these disciplines. The syllabus establishes general methodological and organizational requirements for teaching **“Uzbek Language I” and “Uzbek Language II”** at the university.

This syllabus is intended for undergraduate students and defines the objectives and tasks of the disciplines, the structure of the educational process, expected learning outcomes, the competencies to be developed, types of academic activities, as well as the procedures for current, intermediate, and final assessment of students' knowledge. In addition, the document outlines the teaching and methodological approaches applied in the instruction of these disciplines, as well as the principles for organizing students' independent work.

The primary objective of this syllabus is to implement unified academic standards for teaching **“Uzbek Language I” and “Uzbek Language II,”** ensure the quality of the educational process, and develop in students the necessary knowledge, skills, and competencies that facilitate correct, fluent, and effective communication in Uzbek.

## **1. Course Description**

Currently, changes in the labor market are imposing new requirements on higher education. In particular, there is a need for future specialists to develop qualities such as independent reasoning during the acquisition of professional knowledge, as well as readiness for effective interpersonal and professional communication. The nature of modern professional activity requires mastering the most essential knowledge and skills for both verbal and non-verbal communication and collaboration. An integral and essential component of communication is language education, which serves as the primary tool for its implementation.

The purpose of language education at the university is not only to prepare highly qualified specialists capable of freely communicating in the state language but also to ensure they achieve a professional literacy level sufficient for conducting their future professional activities in Uzbek. Furthermore, practical training in the workplace requires linking education to practice and ensuring graduates meet contemporary professional standards. For this, it is necessary to form in students the most important and essential universal skills in the relevant field of study, particularly in mastering the state language.

## **2. Prerequisites of the Course**

No prerequisites are required for this course.

## **3. Course Objectives**

The aim of this course is to develop in students, both during the learning process and for their future professional activities, the following knowledge and skills:

1. Oral communication skills;
2. Listening skills;
3. Editing (literacy) skills;
4. Public speaking skills;
5. Document writing skills;
6. Academic writing skills.

The course in the first stage relies on the communicative method, i.e., the development of speech based on communication. This approach helps students adapt to the requirements and objectives of the course.

The course topics are designed to be studied in a specific sequence with the goal of developing speech. Each topic includes several sections. These topics are reinforced through assignments and exercises.

During classes, educational technologies and methods such as presentations, debates, problem-solving situations, case studies, blitz surveys, group work, individual projects, group projects, situational games, and dramatized performances are used.

#### 4. Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, students are expected to achieve the following skills during the fall semester:

- Mastery of spelling and punctuation rules of the Uzbek language in written communication;
- Correct use of grammatical forms and structures in speech, and the ability to formulate thoughts grammatically correctly;
- Acquisition of a lexical minimum of 2,200–2,500 words and the ability to use them correctly in texts;
- Ability to read and understand unfamiliar texts containing commonly used words, summarize them in their own words, and answer questions;
- Ability to collect information on current topics, prepare a 3–4 page report, present it orally, and express personal opinions clearly, logically, and coherently;
- Ability to answer questions on a topic, analyze, and structure thoughts using methods such as FSMU and SWOT analysis;
- Ability to retell literary works (2 selected pieces) in their own words, describe the content and structure of literary texts.

#### 5. Independent Study and Assignments

Independent work is aimed at deepening students' knowledge in this subject and involves collecting necessary information for essay writing on pre-selected topics and studying literature independently. It also includes familiarizing students with the best examples of Uzbek and world literature, developing aesthetic taste, distinguishing authentic works of art, understanding their nature, forming a style of thinking, and fostering tolerance towards social, ethnic, religious, and cultural differences. Independent work further enriches vocabulary and develops oral and written communication through literary reading, discussions, and essay writing.

- **Literary reading** – involves preparing a case assignment, presentation, essay, and oral retelling of the work. Written tests and oral exams are conducted.
- **Socially relevant topic** – preparation and presentation of a 650–700 word speech.

Independent assignments must be completed within the specified deadlines. Late submissions are not accepted.
