

**PROCEDURE**  
**for the admission of visually impaired applicants**  
**to the bachelor's degree programmes**  
**of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy**  
**for the 2024/2025 academic year**

Visually impaired applicants taking entrance examinations for admission to higher education institutions shall sit the exams in the traditional format, using either a multi-point grading system or its equivalent five-point grading system, in accordance with the set of subjects established for test examinations by the State Commission on Admissions to Educational Institutions of the Republic of Uzbekistan for the relevant fields of study.

The format of the entrance examinations in each subject shall be determined based on the specific nature of the subject and may be conducted either in written or oral form.

A specially designated staff member shall be assigned to provide explanations and guidance to visually impaired applicants.

For the administration of the entrance examinations, the UWED Admissions Committee shall establish subject-based examination commissions, and a representative of the society of visually impaired persons or persons with disabilities shall be included in the composition of each commission.

The entrance examination syllabi for each subject shall be developed in full compliance with the curricula of general secondary education, secondary specialized education, and vocational education in general academic subjects, and shall be approved by the base higher education institutions in coordination with the Ministry of Higher and Secondary Specialized Education.

Admissions committees of higher education institutions shall organize consultations for visually impaired applicants in the entrance examination subjects in accordance with a specially prepared schedule.

For this category of applicants, the entrance examinations shall be conducted by the Admissions Committee no later than 26 July.

Information on applicants belonging to this category and the results of their entrance examinations shall be submitted to the State Commission and the Agency for Knowledge Assessment by 27 July.

Applicants who have successfully passed the entrance examinations (i.e., those who score above 55 percent of the maximum score under the multi-point grading system, or receive grades of “3”, “4”, or “5” under the five-point grading system) shall be admitted, on the basis of state grants, to specially allocated places without competition, in accordance with the decision of the State Commission.
