1.1. Course Description

This course covers the origin and development of the state and law, including the concept, features, essence, and types of the state, as well as its functions and forms. It also examines the mechanisms of the exercise of state power, the relationship between law and social relations, legal consciousness and legal culture, legal norms and sources of law, law-making processes, the legal system, legal relations, the implementation and interpretation of legal norms, lawful behavior, legal liability, mechanisms of legal regulation, legality and legal order, as well as trends and prospects for the development of the state and law.

1.2. Prerequisites

There are no formal prerequisites for this course.

1.3. Course Objectives

The course aims to provide students with fundamental legal knowledge, develop their competencies in the field of legal studies, ensure a clear understanding of the conceptual framework of the discipline, and enable them to apply this knowledge in practice. The course also seeks to develop students' ability to critically evaluate contemporary legal processes and phenomena at both national and international levels.

1.4. Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students are expected to:

- understand the essence of the state and law and their key features;
- explain the functioning of the state and law;
- describe the forms, functions, and mechanisms of the state;
- understand modern concepts of the state and law;
- explain the relationship between the modern state and law;
- demonstrate theoretical knowledge of the role of the state and law;
- understand the theoretical foundations necessary for the development of legal norms;
- demonstrate knowledge and skills related to the organization and functioning of state bodies;
- interpret and apply normative legal acts;
- draft basic normative legal documents;
- conduct basic legal analysis of current legislation;
- assess compliance of legal acts with the Constitution and international legal standards;

- draft legal documents and make legally grounded decisions within the framework of the law.

1.5. Independent Study

Independent study is aimed at deepening students' knowledge of the course and involves individual work with selected academic literature.

Part I

Students are required to prepare an essay based on assigned readings.

The main requirements for independent work include:

- writing an essay based on the assigned literature;
- demonstrating independence and creativity (analytical approach, formulation of ideas, originality in problem identification and solution);
- providing well-reasoned conclusions;
- maintaining appropriate academic style and clarity of expression.

Essay requirements:

- length: 1200 words ($\pm 10\%$);
- font: Times New Roman, size 14;
- line spacing: 1.5.

Part II

Students must complete five individual assignments within the established deadlines. These may include identifying legal problems, selecting basic research methods, conducting case analysis, content analysis, system analysis, field research, and preparing analytical materials (including video or poster presentations).

All assignments must be submitted on time. Late submissions are not accepted.

2.1. Course Description

The course “Criminal Law I” provides an introduction to the fundamental principles, structure, and system of criminal law. It covers the concept of crime, elements of criminal liability, stages of committing a crime, voluntary abandonment, participation in crime, and related forms of criminal involvement.

The course also examines the concept, system, and types of criminal punishment, as well as the rules of criminal qualification. It is designed to provide students with a general understanding of criminal law and serves as a foundation for further specialization in the legal field.

As a core professional discipline, the course develops basic knowledge and skills in criminal law and prepares students for future professional activity in judicial, law enforcement, and public administration bodies, as well as for further academic study.

2.2. Prerequisites

There are no formal prerequisites for this course.

2.3. Course Objectives

The course aims to:

- introduce students to the fundamental concepts and principles of criminal law;
- develop skills in analyzing criminal law provisions;
- enhance students’ ability to correctly qualify criminal acts;
- develop the ability to distinguish between similar criminal offences;
- provide basic knowledge of the application and interpretation of criminal law;
- develop skills in applying legal norms to practical situations;
- enhance students’ ability to analyze judicial decisions in criminal law;
- promote the use of legal sources, including decisions of the Plenum of the Supreme Court of the Republic of Uzbekistan;
- develop critical thinking in solving criminal law problems.

2.4. Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- explain the basic concepts and principles of criminal law
- analyze elements of crime and distinguish between different types of offences;
- apply rules of criminal qualification to simple legal cases;
- identify mitigating and aggravating circumstances;

- interpret and use criminal law terminology and sources;
- analyze court decisions from a criminal law perspective;
- apply legal norms to resolve practical situations;
- conduct basic analysis of criminal cases;
- formulate reasoned legal conclusions;
- demonstrate basic legal reasoning skills.

2.5. Independent Study

Independent study is aimed at deepening students' knowledge and developing analytical skills. Students are required to complete tasks such as glossary preparation, case analysis, and analytical essays based on selected literature.

Requirements include:

- independent and analytical thinking;
- logical structure and clarity;
- justified conclusions;
- proper academic writing style.

Assignments must be approximately 1200 words ($\pm 10\%$), Times New Roman, size 14, line spacing 1.5.

The course “Administrative Law and Procedure” is one of the core disciplines within the system of modern public law. In its content and approach, the course reflects contemporary developments in administrative law as a branch regulating public administration.

Taking into account advanced institutions and mechanisms of administrative law in foreign jurisdictions, the course examines the key tasks and challenges of administrative law in Uzbekistan in the context of building a rule-of-law state. It is based on the general doctrinal framework of public law disciplines.

3.2. Prerequisites

There are no formal prerequisites for this course.

3.3. Course Objectives

The main objective of the course is to introduce students to the doctrinal foundations and current issues of modern administrative law within the framework of a public law approach.

The course also aims to provide a comprehensive understanding of the main institutions of administrative law, their significance, current state, potential, and prospects for development.

3.4. Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will acquire the following knowledge:

- understand the role of administrative law within the public law system and its importance in public administration and state reform;
- explain the doctrinal foundations of administrative law as a branch of public law;
- describe the basic principles of modern administrative law and their application in legal regulation and practice;
- understand the legal status of individuals within administrative law;
- understand the legal status of administrative bodies;
- explain the balance between public and private interests, state authority, and individual freedoms;
- identify key institutions of administrative law (administrative acts, procedures, administrative justice, etc.);
- understand current trends and directions of administrative law reform;
- use basic administrative law terminology and concepts.

Students will also develop the following skills:

- work with key concepts and terminology of administrative law;
- analyze legislation and law enforcement practice based on administrative law principles;
- assess the balance between state authority and individual rights;
- evaluate the development and reform of administrative law institutions;
- formulate basic proposals for improving administrative legal regulation.

3.5. Independent Study

Independent study is aimed at deepening students' knowledge and developing analytical skills.

Students are required to independently study selected academic literature and prepare assignments based on practical questions, case analysis, and essays.

The main requirements include:

- preparation of answers to practical questions;
- demonstration of independent and analytical thinking;
- logical structure and well-reasoned conclusions;
- legal analysis of cases supported by normative legal acts;
- appropriate academic writing style.

The course “Judicial System and Law Enforcement Agencies” is designed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the system of law enforcement institutions, including the Ministry of Justice, the прокуратура (Prosecutor’s Office), internal affairs bodies, the State Security Service, tax and customs authorities, as well as the legal profession (advocacy), the Authorized Person of the Oliy Majlis for Human Rights (Ombudsman), the National Human Rights Centre of the Republic of Uzbekistan, and legal service institutions.

The course examines the origin and development, modern structure, functions, and responsibilities of these institutions. It provides students with a general understanding of law enforcement agencies and serves as a foundation for further specialization in national law.

As a core professional discipline within the bachelor’s programme, the course develops basic knowledge of law enforcement activities and their impact on political and social processes. It also prepares students for future professional activity in public administration, judicial and law enforcement bodies, and legal services, as well as for further academic study.

4.2. Prerequisites

There are no formal prerequisites for this course.

4.3. Course Objectives

The course aims to:

- introduce students to the system of law enforcement and judicial institutions;
- provide knowledge of the origin, development, structure, and functions of law enforcement bodies;
- develop understanding of the principles governing the organization and functioning of these institutions;
- enhance students’ ability to analyze law enforcement activities within the framework of public law;
- develop basic skills in applying legal norms related to law enforcement practice.

4.4. Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- explain the legal foundations of law enforcement agencies in the Republic of Uzbekistan;
- describe the structure and system of law enforcement bodies;

- apply legal norms regulating the organization and functioning of these institutions;
- analyze legislation and practical issues related to law enforcement activities;
- use relevant legal terminology and sources accurately;
- work with legal documents, academic literature, and analytical materials;
- identify and describe legal problems arising in the field of law enforcement practice.

The main requirements include:

- preparation of glossary entries, case analyses, and analytical essays;
- demonstration of independent and analytical thinking;
- logical structure and well-reasoned conclusions;
- appropriate academic writing style.

- line spacing: 1.5.

As a core professional discipline within the bachelor’s programme, the course develops practical legal skills and prepares students for professional activity in public administration, judicial and law enforcement bodies, and legal services, as well as for further academic study.

Completion of the course “Criminal Law I (CRML12C6)” is required as a prerequisite.

5.3. Course Objectives



- conduct independent research and analysis using international legal doctrines and sources.

9.5. Independent Study

Independent study is aimed at deepening students' knowledge and developing research and analytical skills.

Students are required to independently study selected academic literature and prepare essays based on assigned materials.

The main requirements include:

- demonstration of independent and analytical thinking;
- logical structure and well-reasoned conclusions;
- originality in problem identification and solution;
- appropriate academic writing style.

Essay requirements:

- length: 1200 words ($\pm 10\%$);
- font: Times New Roman, size 14;
- line spacing: 1.5.

Students must complete five individual assignments within established deadlines. These may include analysis of international legal problems, application of research methods, case analysis, content analysis, system analysis, field research, and preparation of analytical materials (presentations, posters, etc.).

All assignments must be submitted on time. Late submissions are not accepted.
