

CHARTER

of the "Students Council" of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy

I. General Provisions

1. The Students Council of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (hereinafter referred to as a "Students Council") is a consultative body without legal status, accountable to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the administration of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy.

2. In its activities, the Students Council is guided by the Constitution of the Republic of Uzbekistan and its laws, decisions of the chambers of the Oliy Majlis of the Republic of Uzbekistan, decrees, resolutions of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan, and other legal acts, as well as this Charter.

3. The term of office of the Students Council is one (1) year. After the term of office expires, the previous composition continues to function until the new Students Council begins its work.

4. The Students Council has its own logo, badges for its members, and identification cards of the established form.

5. The official name of the Students Council:

a) in the state language:

Full name – Жаҳон иқтисодиёти ва дипломатия университети ҳузуридаги Талабалар Кенгаши; abbreviated name – Талабалар Кенгаши;

b) in Latin script: Jahon iqtisodiyoti va diplomatiya universiteti huzuridagi Talabalar kengashi; abbreviated name – Talabalar kengashi;

c) in Russian:

full name – Студенческий Совет при Университете мировой экономики и дипломатии; abbreviated name – Студенческий Совет;

d) in English:

full name – Students Council under the University of World Economy and Diplomacy; abbreviated name – Students Council.

II. Goals and Objectives of the Students Council

6. The goal of the Students Council is to support students of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy, raise their legal awareness and literacy, turn the youth into an active political force in society, strengthen their political and legal knowledge and skills, involve them in legislative processes, and promote laws among the student body, increasing their engagement in the Council's activities.

7. The objectives of the Students Council include:

7.1. Developing proposals for improving legal acts aimed at protecting the rights, freedoms, and legal interests of students;

7.2. Enhancing students' political knowledge, promoting patriotism, and cooperating with representative bodies;

7.3. Increasing youth awareness of the activities of the Council and all stages of the legislative process;

7.4. Promoting youth involvement in the development of new and priority directions for improving legislative work;

7.5. Developing proposals for the introduction of effective mechanisms for preventing violations of the law among students;

7.6. Assisting in raising the legal culture of the youth, expanding their intellectual, moral, aesthetic, and cultural horizons.

III. Rights of the Students Council

8. The Students Council has the right to:

8.1. Participate in the meetings of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy;

8.2. Exchange experiences and information with relevant international and foreign organizations in the prescribed manner;

8.3. Form its own budget from sources not prohibited by law.

IV. Election of a Member of the Students Council

9. The Board of Trustees (hereinafter referred to as the "Board of Trustees") leads the faculty commissions created to conduct elections to the Students Council and ensures the elections are held in accordance with these Regulations.

The composition of the Board of Trustees is formed from the following representatives:

1. Graduates of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy;
2. Talented senior students of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy.

10. To organize and conduct the elections to the Students Council, the university commission forms a faculty commission at least fifteen days before the elections. The composition of the faculty commission is formed from the following representatives:

1. Faculty Dean;
2. Deputy Deans of the Faculty;
3. Tutors.

Faculty commissions terminate their activities after the registration of the elected members by the university commission.

11. The start of the election is announced by the university commission at least three months before the expiration of the previous Students Council's term.

12. A citizen of the Republic of Uzbekistan, who is at least eighteen years old on the day of the election, may submit a written application to the faculty commission to participate in the elections.

Candidates whose applications meet the requirements of these Regulations are elected in two stages.

13. In the first stage, the faculty commission selects the candidates' applications. The commission pays attention to the following aspects in the answers to the questions in the application:

recent developments in legislation;

knowledge and understanding of public administration;

views on ongoing reforms in society;

level of legal awareness and legal culture.

Based on the results of the first stage, the commission elects five candidates by secret ballot.

14. In the second stage, candidates are interviewed by the faculty commission while presenting their election program. The faculty commission elects one candidate by secret ballot.

The following factors are taken into consideration during the elections:

the candidate's election program aimed at solving youth-related issues and proposed solutions;

public speaking skills and the ability to convey the essence of the program to the audience;

knowledge and quick-wittedness.

15. After each stage, a protocol is drawn up and signed by the chairperson of the commission. One copy of the protocol is submitted to the university commission.

16. In addition to the selected students, one candidate from each faculty is nominated to participate in the election for the position of Chairman of the Students Council.

17. When nominating candidates for the position of Chairman, the faculty commission takes into account the following qualities of the student:

political and legal activity (organization or participation in projects);

writing or co-authoring scientific papers, articles, and manuals on public administration, state youth policy, judicial-legal, cultural, sports, and scientific-educational spheres;

receipt of state awards;

achievements in various contests, olympiads, competitions in science, culture, sports, and other areas;

activity in the media and the ability to inspire and lead other young people;

activity in other areas of society.

V. Status of a Member of the "Students Council"

18. A member of the Students Council is elected on a voluntary basis for the term of the Council's powers. A member of the Students Council of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy cannot simultaneously be a deputy of the Legislative Chamber, a member of the Senate, or a local council of deputies.

19. A member of the Students Council is issued a certificate and badge by the university's Students Council commission. The member uses the certificate and badge for the duration of their term of office.

20. Rights of a member of the Students Council:

20.1. To be elected as coordinator of the Students Council and elect others;

20.2. To propose issues for discussion at the Students Council meeting;

20.3. To propose and comment on the agenda and discussed issues at the Council meeting;

20.4. To express opinions on candidates elected by the Students Council;

20.5. To participate in debates at the meetings, ask questions to the speaker and the chair;

20.6. To speak to justify proposals and explain reasons for voting;

20.7. To submit texts of their speeches, proposals, or remarks to the chair at the meeting;

20.8. To have a decisive vote on all issues discussed at the Students Council meetings.

21. Duties of a member of the Students Council:

21.1. To comply with the applicable laws, the requirements of this Regulation, and execute decisions of the Council;

21.2. To actively participate in the implementation of the primary goals and objectives of the Students Council;

21.3. To personally attend Council meetings and voting, in accordance with the Council's Rules;

21.4. To notify the Students Council if unable to attend a Council or committee meeting;

21.5. To contribute to enhancing the authority and influence of the Council among students and in society;

21.6. To promote and support the activities of the Students Council;

21.7. To promote skills in preventing violations of the law among the youth;

21.8. To actively participate in all Council events, programs, and projects;

21.9. To coordinate with the Chairman of the Council in fulfilling tasks and inform them about their activities;

21.10. Members may also have other duties in accordance with the law.

22. The powers of a member of the Students Council can be terminated early in the following cases:

22.1. Upon submission of a written resignation from their duties;

22.2. In case of election or appointment to a position incompatible with membership in the Council according to law;

22.3. In case of expulsion from the student body of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy;

22.4. In the case of death.

Additionally, the issue of dismissing a member of the Students Council may be considered at a Council meeting and decided by a majority vote of its members.

VI. Organization of the Activities of the Students Council

23. The organizational form of the Students Council's activity is its general meetings, which are held at least four times a year. The meetings of the Students Council are open and transparent.

The procedure for organizing and conducting meetings is determined by the Rules of the Students Council.

24. The Students Council makes decisions on submitted issues, as well as on the organization of its internal activities.

Decisions of the Students Council are made by a majority vote of its total membership.

25. The Chairman of the Students Council:

25.1. Convenes and chairs Council meetings;

25.2. Provides general leadership in preparing issues for discussion by the Council;

25.3. Coordinates the activities of the Council's committees and commissions;

25.4. Submits proposals approved by the Council to the administration of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy;

25.5. Engages in cooperation with international partners in consultation with the administration;

25.6. Signs decisions of the Council;

25.7. Organizes control over the implementation of Council decisions;

25.8. Has the right to veto orders on the expulsion of students from the university;

25.9. Resolves other issues within their powers.

26. To ensure effective organization of the Students Council's activities, a Board of Trustees is formed.

The Board of Trustees consists of three active students and graduates of the university.

The Board of Trustees:

26.1. Forms the draft agenda for Students Council meetings;

26.2. Coordinates the work of the Council;

26.3. Reviews proposals on youth-related issues and decides on whether to submit them to the Council or reject them, based on conclusions from the responsible department;

26.4. Facilitates the organization of the work of Council members at their faculties;

26.5. Resolves other issues related to the organization of the Council's activities.

The Council makes decisions on issues within its competence by a majority vote of its members.

The Chairman of the Board of Trustees leads its meetings and signs its decisions.

27. The Students Council forms committees from its members for the term of its powers.

The following departments are established within the Students Council:

27.1. The Chairman of the Council is the primary representative defending the interests of students before the administration and other organizations. The Chairman is responsible for the development and management of the Council's strategy. They coordinate the work of each Council member in accordance with its decisions and oversee the implementation of tasks by the departments. The Chairman is also an official member of the Academic Council of the University and has veto power on issues concerning students.

27.2. The Chairman's Advisor on Information Policy — Press Secretary — is responsible for all relations in this area and is in charge of publicizing the Council's activities in social networks.

27.3. The Advisor on External Relations organizes international conferences, roundtables, seminars with guest lecturers, and implements various international projects, such as Model UN, Model SCO, Model OSCE, Model CIS, and Model EU, in cooperation with local and international organizations.

27.4. The Advisor on Research assists students in publishing their research papers in leading global journals and organizes workshops on academic publishing with the help of university professors.

27.5. The Advisor on Student Affairs ensures effective cooperation between students and the university administration, protects the rights and interests of

students, and facilitates their comprehensive development and adaptation to the university environment.

27.6. The Advisor on Project Management and Organizational Issues manages the process of achieving Council objectives within set deadlines and is responsible for events under approved projects. They are also the main organizer of the UWED WEEK event.

27.7. The Advisor on Foreign Languages works closely with the university's foreign language departments and is responsible for developing communicative competence in foreign languages among students.

27.8. The Advisor on Volunteer Issues compiles a list of university volunteers and organizes their participation in significant political events in Uzbekistan as volunteer translators.

27.9. The Advisor on Sports is responsible for all sports events and clubs at the university.

VII. Final Provisions

29. The Rector of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy may provide references for members of the Students Council when they apply for jobs in government agencies, companies, institutions, and organizations.

30. The reorganization and dissolution of the Students Council are carried out in accordance with the law.
