REGULATION ON THE PROCEDURE FOR PARTIAL COMPENSATION OF RENTAL PAYMENTS FOR STUDENTS RESIDING UNDER A RESIDENTIAL LEASE AGREEMENT

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Regulation On the Procedure for Partial Compensation of Rental Payments for Students Residing Under a Residential Lease Agreement at the University of World Economy and Diplomacy

In order to promote student welfare, provide social support, and expand equal access to higher education, the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (UWED) implements state-established mechanisms for the partial compensation of rental payments made by students residing in rented accommodation.

The mechanisms for supporting students in covering accommodation and rental expenses at UWED are implemented in accordance with the [Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. 605 dated 24 September 2021, “On Measures to Introduce a System for Compensating Rental Payments Made by Students Residing Under Lease Agreements,”](#) as well as the University's internal Order No. 239-1-UM dated 22 December 2025.

As a result, the following mechanisms are implemented at the University:

1. In order to ensure the implementation of Resolution No. 605 of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated 24 September 2021, the University of World Economy and Diplomacy provides institutional support to students residing under residential lease agreements.

Within the framework of this mechanism, a designated portion of the monthly rental payment of students who meet the requirements established by applicable legislation is compensated from the State Budget of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

2. The procedure for receiving, reviewing, and approving applications for rental payment compensation is carried out in accordance with the internal procedures approved by the Rector's Order No. 239-1-UM dated 22 December 2025.

Applications and supporting documents are submitted and reviewed through the **billing.edu.uz** information system and in accordance with the University's established internal procedures.

3. The following individuals participate as members of the Commission responsible for reviewing applications:

- First Vice-Rector for Youth Affairs ;
- Faculty Deans;
- Responsible member of the Office of Youth Affairs;
- Representative of the Women's Council;
- Head of the Student Admission and Registration Office;

- Chief Specialist of the Finance Office.

Brief Guide for Students

Who is Eligible to Apply?

- Students residing under a valid residential lease agreement and meeting the requirements established [by applicable legislation](#).

Where Should Applications Be Submitted?

- Applications and required [supporting](#) documents must be submitted electronically through the [kontrakt.edu.uz](#) and [ijara.soliq.uz](#) information systems.

Stages of the Application Review Process

1. Application Submission. The student submits an application, a lease agreement, and other required documents through the [kontrakt.edu.uz](#) and [ijara.soliq.uz](#) information systems within the prescribed deadlines.

2. Verification of Documents. The responsible officer of the Youth Affairs Office verifies the completeness, compliance with required formats, and authenticity of the submitted documents. Documents meeting the established requirements are uploaded to the [billing.edu.uz](#) information system.

3. Faculty-Level Review. Faculty representatives register applications, conduct a preliminary review, and forward the documents to course coordinators.

4. Assessment of the Student's Social Circumstances. Course coordinators assess the student's social circumstances, the existence of a valid lease agreement, the accuracy of the submitted information, and the student's eligibility for a subsidy.

Based on this assessment, course coordinators prepare a written recommendation and submit it to the University Commission.

5. Commission Review. Commission members conduct a comprehensive review of applications and recommendations, request additional information where necessary, and make decisions regarding the allocation of subsidies or compensation.

6. Commission Minutes. Decisions adopted by the Commission are formalized in official minutes and approved through the E-IMZO electronic signature system.

7. Issuance of an Order. The Rector or an authorized Vice-Rector approves the relevant order based on the Commission's decision.

8. Disbursement of Funds. The Finance Office processes compensation payments in accordance with the approved order and established procedures.

Monitoring and Implementation

To ensure transparency and legality in the application review process, submitted documents are subject to regular verification.

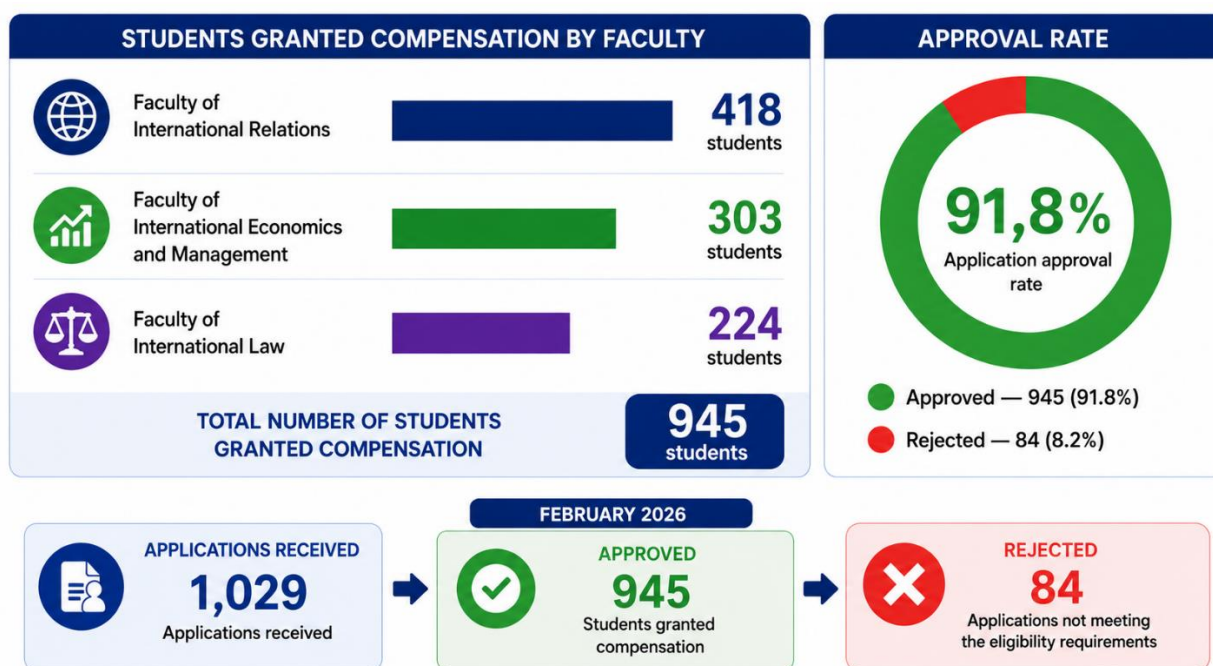
If false or inaccurate information is identified, the student is notified through the kontrakt.edu.uz information system within three working days, and compensation payments are discontinued.

If changes occur in the student's social circumstances or supporting documentation, an updated application and relevant documents must be resubmitted through the kontrakt.edu.uz information system. To ensure the proper use of budgetary funds and, where necessary, the recovery of excessive or unjustified payments, appropriate measures shall be taken in accordance with established procedures.

Statistical Information

In February 2026, a total of **1,029 applications** were received and reviewed by the University Commission in accordance with established criteria.

As shown in **Infographic 1**, pursuant to UWED Meeting Minutes No. 4135 dated 19 February 2026 and Rector's Order No. 350-00178/25-26 dated 26 February 2026, issued to implement the decisions contained therein, rental payment compensation was granted to **945 students**, while **84 applications** were rejected due to non-compliance with the applicable requirements (Infographic 1).
