Regulation on the Procedure for Compensating Living Expenses of Certain Categories of Students Residing in Student Dormitories at the University of World Economy and Diplomacy

In order to ensure student welfare, provide social support, and expand equal access to higher education, the University of World Economy and Diplomacy implements state-established mechanisms for compensating the living expenses of certain categories of students residing in student dormitories.

This support system is implemented in accordance with the Regulation “**On the Procedure for Compensating Living Expenses of Certain Categories of Students in Student Dormitories of State Higher Education Institutions,**” approved by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. 32 dated **28 January 2026**.

In accordance with this Regulation, the living expenses of students studying in the full-time mode of education whose families are included in the **Unified Register of Social Protection** are compensated from the State Budget of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

As a result, the following mechanisms are implemented at the University:

1. In order to ensure the implementation of Resolution No. 32 of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated 28 January 2026, the University of World Economy and Diplomacy provides financial assistance to certain categories of students residing in student dormitories.
2. The process of receiving, reviewing, and approving applications for compensation of dormitory living expenses is carried out in accordance with the applicable regulatory legal acts and the University's internal procedures. Applications and supporting documents are reviewed through the **billing.edu.uz** information system.
3. The review of applications is carried out by a University Commission consisting of:
 - the First Vice Rector for Youth Issues;
 - faculty deans;
 - course coordinators;
 - representatives of the Youth Affairs Office;
 - representatives of the Student Admission and Registration Office;

- specialists of the Finance Office.

The Commission acts as the authorized body responsible for reviewing and evaluating applications and making final decisions.

Brief Guide for Students

Who is eligible to apply?

- Students residing in student dormitories, studying in the full-time mode of education, and belonging to families included in the **Unified Register of Social Protection**.

Where should applications be submitted?

- Applications and the required supporting documents must be submitted electronically through the **kontrakt.edu.uz** and **ijara.soliq.uz** information systems.

Stages of Application Review

1. Application Submission. The student submits an application and other required documents through the **kontrakt.edu.uz** and **ijara.soliq.uz** information systems within the established deadlines.

2. Verification of Documents. The responsible officer of the Youth Affairs Office verifies the completeness, compliance with the required format, and authenticity of the submitted documents and uploads eligible documents to the **billing.edu.uz** system.

3. Faculty-Level Review. Faculty representatives register applications, conduct a preliminary review, and forward the documents to course coordinators.

4. Assessment of the Student's Social Status. Course coordinators examine the student's social status, verify inclusion in the **Unified Register of Social Protection**, and review information confirming eligibility for the subsidy.

Based on the assessment, a written conclusion is prepared and submitted to the University Commission.

5. Commission Review. Members of the Commission conduct a comprehensive review of applications and conclusions, request additional information where necessary, and make decisions regarding the allocation of a subsidy or compensation.

6. Commission Protocol. Decisions adopted by the Commission are formalized in

the form of a protocol and approved through the **E-IMZO** electronic signature system.

7. Issuance of an Order. The Rector or an authorized Vice-Rector approves the relevant order based on the Commission's decision.

8. Transfer of Funds. The Finance Office transfers the approved subsidy funds to students' bank cards in accordance with the established procedures.

Monitoring and Implementation

To ensure transparency and legality in the application review process, submitted documents are regularly verified.

The accuracy of information confirming a student's eligibility for the subsidy, as well as information regarding the student's social status, is subject to ongoing monitoring.

If false or inaccurate information is identified, the student is notified in accordance with the established procedures and the allocation of the subsidy is discontinued.

In the event of any change in the student's social status or supporting documentation, updated information and relevant documents must be resubmitted.

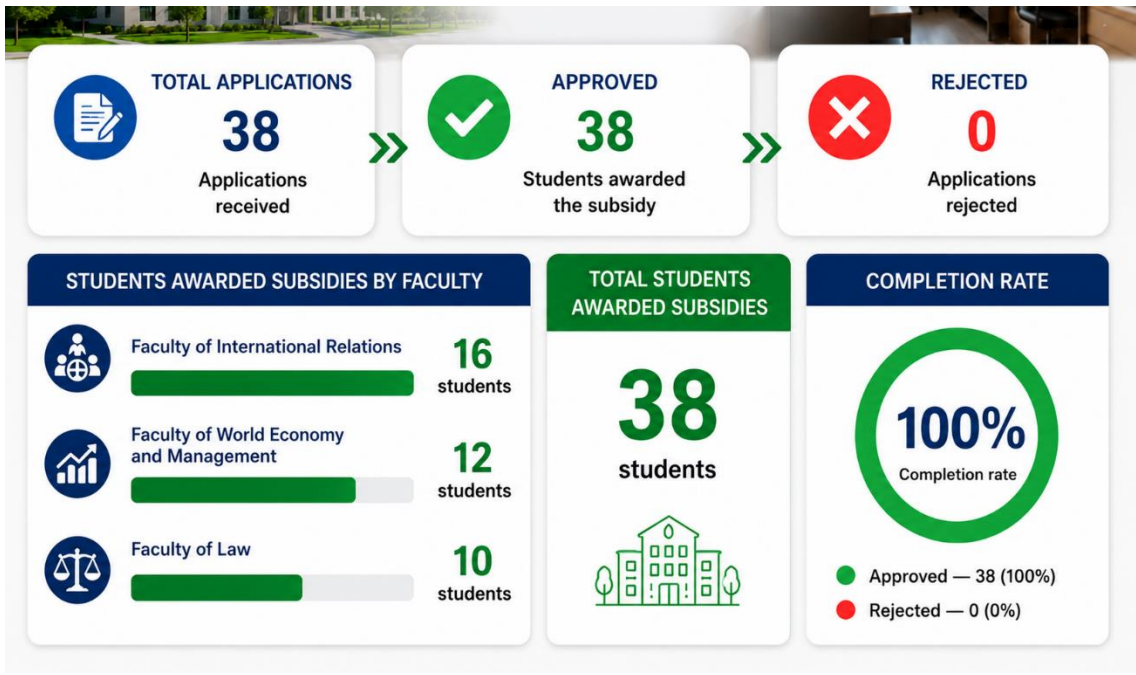
Regular monitoring is conducted to ensure the targeted use of State Budget funds. Where necessary, measures are taken in accordance with established procedures to recover unjustified or excess payments.

Statistical Information

In **March 2026**, a total of **38 applications** were received under the program for compensating the living expenses of certain categories of students residing in student dormitories through State Budget funds.

The applications were reviewed by the University Commission in accordance with the requirements of the Regulation approved by Resolution No. 32 of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated **28 January 2026**.

As shown in **Infographic 1**, based on the UWED meeting protocol No. **2673-1873-8315** dated **8 April 2026**, and the UWED Rector's Order No. **6082-1164-9252** dated **18 April 2026**, adopted for the implementation of the protocol, subsidies were granted to **38 students**.

These results demonstrate the University’s commitment to supporting students through social assistance measures, reducing the financial burden associated with accommodation expenses, and promoting equal access to higher education.
