

Summary of the Academic Council Meeting (Minutes No. 4)

At the meeting of the Academic Council of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy held on 16 April 2026 under the chairmanship of the Rector with participation of vice-rectors, deans, and structural units, key issues on admissions, scientific councils, doctoral studies, and academic regulations were considered.

Admission Results (2025/2026)

The report of the Admissions Commission was heard and approved. It was decided to:

1. approve the final results of bachelor's and master's admissions;
2. propose reforms including unified admission platform and revised quotas;
3. consider introduction of entrance exams for master's level;
4. submit proposals to higher authorities.

2. Scientific Councils' Reports

Reports of three dissertation councils (Political Science, Economics, International Law) were reviewed and approved. It was decided to:

1. strengthen monitoring of doctoral and independent researchers;
2. revise and resubmit dissertation topics;
3. accelerate PhD completion timelines through a roadmap;
4. continue improving council effectiveness and reporting.

3. Doctoral Studies and Dissertation Topics

The Council approved dissertation topics of doctoral and independent researchers. It was decided to:

1. confirm all approved dissertation themes;
2. assign responsibility to supervisors and departments for timely defense;
3. ensure publication of topics in official systems.

4. Academic Mobility and Credit Recognition

A new regulation on academic exchange recognition was approved. It was decided to:

1. implement credit recognition for exchange students;
2. regulate re-study procedures;
3. apply the system from 2025/2026 academic year;

4. strengthen academic mobility support.

Staff Compensation

A decision was made on additional pay for a newly appointed professor under Government Resolution No. 1030. It was decided to:

1. apply payments from September to December 2025;
2. ensure compliance with national regulations.

Institutional Development and Quality Assurance

The Council also reviewed broader academic governance and decided to:

1. strengthen doctoral supervision and research management;
2. improve efficiency of scientific councils;
3. continue systematic monitoring of academic performance indicators.
